RULES AND INFORMATION

- EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION (USEF) RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THOSE RULES.
- Management reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show.
- Copies of current American Morgan Horse Association (AMHA) and USEF membership cards and proof of horse registration must be presented with entries before back numbers are issued.
- Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., or an organization having registry reciprocity, (Canadian Morgan Horse Association, British Morgan Horse Society, Swedish Morgan Horse Society.) Horses must be entered under their full registered name or if under one year of age be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement.
- Horses must be made available for inspection by an official designated by the American Morgan Horse Association.
- The Morgan Gold Cup Horse Show assumes no responsibility for situations and actions resulting from an individual serving or consuming alcohol on the show grounds.
- The Morgan Gold Cup Horse show reserves the right to refuse entry

AMATEURS / ADULTS

Amateur and adult classes are limited to competitors 18 years of age or older as of December 1, 2023. Exception: Participants in the Junior Exhibitor Park Saddle and Junior Exhibitor Park Harness are permitted to enter the Amateur Championship, if there are no junior exhibitor championships offered in these divisions. Any horse shown by an amateur in a ladies or youth class, qualifies for an amateur championship if no ladies or youth championship is offered.

AMHA MEDAL CLASSES

Exhibitors in AMHA Medal Classes must be AMHA members in good standing. Riders in the Saddle Seat, Western Seat, Hunter Seat on the Flat and Reining Seat must be under 22 years of age as of December 1st of the competition year.

AMHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Life, youth life, standard and premium members of AMHA shall be eligible to participate in all regional show classes. A non-member of AMHA may participate as a rider, driver, handler, owner, lessee, agent or trainer at regional shows by paying a non-member fee of \$45.00. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members;

5) walk trot (11 years and under) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program). Also exempted from this requirement are residents of other nations who are members in good standing of their national federation.

ARENA

SHOW RING SIZE: 112' x 225' Covered warm up ring 100' x 200'. Footing is comprised of sand, loam and wood shavings with a dirt base.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Entrance to the fairgrounds will be made through the gate at 717 E 17th Ave, Columbus, Ohio 43211. Horses will be officially admitted to the grounds beginning at 12:01 AM Tuesday, June 11, 2024. Exhibitors planning on arriving before this time must make those arrangements with Barb Dunham at 740-352-8562. Early arrivals will be charged \$25.00 per day per stall. All horses and exhibitors must vacate the grounds by 12:00 PM Sunday, June 16, 2024. Please be advised the OEC mandates all stalls must be vacated by noon the day following the show to initiate prompt cleaning of the facility. An additional fee of \$25 will be assessed for each stall still occupied at noon Sunday, June 16, 2024.

BEDDING

Orders for bedding can be made prior to your arrival by contacting Chad Kuhlwein at 614-989-2142. Pre-bedding will be available.

BOX SEATS

Boxed seating may be reserved on a first come, first served basis after the Platinum and Diamond boxes have been assigned. Boxed seating is available in the following sizes: 6 seats for \$150.00; 8 seats for \$200.00; 10 seats for \$250.00; 12 seats for \$300.00. Reservations may be made on the entry blank.

CAMPERS

Camping spaces are available at a charge determined by the Ohio Expo Center. This includes water, electric and sewage, payable at the Ohio Expo Center. Tow vehicles used to enter and leave the Expositions grounds are required to purchase a parking permit in addition to paying camping fees.

CHANGES/SCRATCHES

All changes and scratches must be completed <u>two hours</u> before the start of each session.

4% convenience fee will be assessed when using a credit card.

ENTRY REGULATIONS

- One owner per entry blank. If extra entry blanks are needed, photocopies are allowed.
- Entry blanks must be completed in full, signed, and accompanied by full
 payment, copies of the horse's registration papers and copies of current USEF
 and AMHA membership cards. Entries will not be processed without the
 aforementioned being complete.
- All exhibitors and trainers or their agents, every rider, driver and handler (or their
 agents) must sign the entry blank. The signature of a parent or guardian of a
 minor participant is also required. If there is no parent or guardian available to
 sign, the minor's trainer is to do so.
- No entry will be processed that has split any charges between exhibitors, horses, or stables.
- All payments are processed upon receipt. If an open check is sent with entries, the check will be deposited immediately for the full amount owed. <u>No postdated checks will be accepted</u>. A 4% convenience fee will be assessed when using a credit card.
- Any entry received without payment will not be processed until full payment has been received. If payment is received after deadline, the entry will be subject to post entry fees.
- Entries must be postmarked by May 14, 2024, to avoid a post entry fee
- Cross entries will be accepted in any class as long as AMHA and USEF regulations are followed.

EXHIBITORS' MEETING

Exhibitors and trainers are encouraged to meet with the directors of the Gold Cup to ask questions, make suggestions, and present constructive criticism. This meeting will be held at 12:00 pm on Tuesday, June 14, 2024, in the Horse Show Office.

FIRE CODE

Ohio State Fire Marshall's fire code could not be quoted in its entirety however these are items that pertain exclusively to the Gilligan Complex stalls.

- Any/all extension cords used must be UDL approved.
- If you are enclosing the top of a stall it must be equipped with a UDL battery operated smoke detector and Fire Extinguisher

FOOD AND BEVERAGE SERVICE

Because the Ohio Expo Center/Ohio State Fairgrounds is a permit premise, it is illegal to bring alcoholic beverages of any kind into the stabling and show arena. <u>All alcoholic</u> beverages must be purchased from the permit holder, Schmidt's.

GATE ADMISSION AND PARKING

Entrance to the fairgrounds will be through the gate at 717 E 17th Ave, Columbus, Ohio 43211. There will be a charge on every vehicle entering the fairgrounds. A permit sticker for four days, five days, or longer may be purchased at the gate. TRAILERS or VEHICLES MAY BE PARKED ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE STALLING AREAS (north or west of the complex) BEHIND THE FACILITY. Trailers are NOT to be parked south of the Coliseum. As soon as possible after unloading, you must remove your vehicles from the loading area.

BICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS, HOVERBOARDS, ETC ARE NOT TO BE RIDDEN IN STABLING AREAS BY JUVENILES.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: STATE OF OHIO

Each equine brought into Ohio:

- Shall be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued at the point
 of origin immediately prior to entering Ohio, certifying that they have been given
 a careful, clinical inspection and been found free of symptoms of any
 dangerously infectious, contagious, communicable disease or known exposure
 thereto. Rectal temperature at the time of examination must be recorded on the
 certificate of veterinary inspection and
- If twelve months of age or more, shall be accompanied by evidence that the identified animal was negative to an official test for the disease, equine infectious anemia, conducted by a laboratory approved by the United States Department of Agriculture. This test must have been conducted within the twelve-month period preceding the date of importation into Ohio.
- Upon request by an authorized representative of the Ohio Department of Agriculture, the person responsible for each equine must make available a chronological list of dates, places and events this animal has attended within thirty days prior to entry.
- All equine imported into Ohio from a state where the existence of the disease, Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis, "VEE", has been confirmed within the proceeding twelve months prior to the date of importation into Ohio shall have been vaccinated against VEE, by a licensed and accredited veterinarian, not less than fourteen days and no more that twelve months preceding the date of importation, and shall be subject to inspection and quarantine upon arrival at destination.

Reference Regulation: 901:1-17-07

REQUIREMENTS: USEF

GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule 1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be

vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested. 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.

HELMETS

Protective headgear must be worn by riders in lead line classes at all times while mounted. See rule GR801.

HOLDS

There will be absolutely no class holds accepted.

LONGEING

There will be absolutely no longeing of horses in the Coliseum or make up arena.

Horses may be longed in Cooper Arena only which will be open Monday. NO RIDING
OR DRIVING IN COOPER ARENA.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

NOVICE/LIMIT DESIGNATION

Novice and Limit classes are open to horses which have not won three and six first place ribbons respectively, at Regular Competitions of the Federation or Equestrian Canada in the particular performance division or level in which they show. See rule GR135.

POST ENTRIES

May 14, 2024 is the closing date for entries. Post entries may be made at \$20.00 additional charge PER HORSE. This additional fee is a one-time fee and applies to added classes for

that horse. For example: If your horse is not pre-entered a \$20.00 fee will be charged in addition to all other normal charges and will enable that horse to be entered in as many classes as desired without additional cost aside from the normal entry fee. If your horse had been entered by May 14 and you desire to add additional classes no additional charge is incurred other than the normal entry fee for those classes. All post entries for any class will close two (2) hours prior to the start of the first class of the session in which the class is to be shown. There will be no post entry fee for 2-year-old performance classes, UPHA Classic classes, stake classes, and championships

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

- A Gold Cup is presented to the winner of each preliminary class.
- Ribbons will be presented to entries placing first through eighth in all classes.
- Payouts for all championships, excluding in-hand, equitation and walk-trot/jog, are as follows:

\$200	\$100	\$50	\$30	\$20	Ribbons

- Payout for the UPHA Classic classes will be in accordance with UPHA guidelines.
- Prize money will be mailed to exhibitors within thirty days following the show.
 All checks must be cashed within thirty days.

RETAIL SPACE

Commercial exhibit indoor space is available for \$50.00 per space including electricity. Outdoor commercial exhibit space is available for \$100.00 plus electric. Contact Barbara Dunham at 740-352-8562.

RING PROCEDURE AND CONDUCT

- In classes that show collectively, two minutes will be allowed after the first horse
 enters the ring. At the end of the two minutes, the gate will be closed and the
 class will proceed.
- A starting order will be established in classes in which horses compete
 individually and a maximum of one minute will be allowed for an entry to enter
 the ring. The class is considered complete when the cards are handed to the
 ringmaster or announcer.
- All riders, drivers, and attendants must be appropriately dressed in all classes.
- No loud and boisterous actions will be tolerated at ringside.

SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

- All entries must be accompanied with a check or money order and payable to The Morgan Gold Cup Horse Show, Inc. and mailed to the Show Secretary. All fees are stated in U.S. currency.
- MasterCard, Visa, Discover or American Express may be used for payment of all fees. A 4% convenience fee will be assessed when using a credit card.
- Any exhibitor with an open account must settle the account or leave an open check to be closed at the conclusion of the show. Back numbers will not be issued until this requirement and all other USEF and AMHA requirements regarding signatures are met.

- All checks returned for insufficient funds will be charged a \$50.00 handling fee
 and must be replaced by a certified or cashier's check. No one will be allowed to
 show if he/she has a bad check or handling fee outstanding.
- All payments are processed upon receipt. If an open check is sent with entries, the check will be deposited immediately for the full amount owed. <u>No postdated</u> checks will be accepted. All fees must be settled by 7 days post show or \$50 will be assessed.
- Any entry received without payment will not be processed until full payment has been received. If payment is received after deadline, the entry will be subject to post entry fees.

SHARPS DISPOSAL

Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

SHOW SECRETARY

- The show secretary's office is located in the center of the Gilligan Complex.
- Exhibitors/Trainers with ten (10) or more horses are encouraged to make an
 appointment with the show secretary to expedite the processing of their entries.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Special Presentations or retirement ceremonies are available during the evening sessions. These will be limited to one per night. Time will be allowed on a first come first served basis. Maximum ring time allowed will be 10 minutes. A fee of \$500.00, which includes ring time, stabling, and a flyer in show folder, will be assessed. Board approval is needed before ring time is scheduled. Requests are to be made to Tim Roesink by email at grovepointeltd@netscape.net or phone at 330-350-2837.

SPONSORSHIPS

Diamond Level-\$2000.00, receive 2 championship classes of choice; Large (12 seat) box seat; recognition during an evening session of company/sponsor/stable with signage in center ring and special recognition on the show grounds.

Platinum Level-\$1000.00, receive 1 championship classes of choice; Large (10 seat) box seat; recognition during an evening session of company/sponsor/stable with signage in center ring and special recognition on the show grounds.

Gold Level-\$500.00, receive 1 championship class of choice if possible; two qualifying performance or in-hand classes of choice; recognition during an AM session of company/sponsor/stable with signage in center ring.

Silver Level-\$250.00, receive 1 championship class of choice if possible.

Bronze Level-\$100.00, receive 1 in-hand or qualifying class of choice if possible.

SPLITTING, CANCELLING, OR COMBINING OF CLASSES

- Should the number of entries warrant, the Show Management reserves the right to split any class. The final number of entries in a class will be determined one hour prior to the session in which the class in question is to be held.
- Harness classes will be split if they contain 12 or more entries.
- Saddle classes will be split if they contain 20 or more entries.
- Walk trot classes will be split if they contain more than 12 entries.
- When a class is split it will be split by management on a numerical (every other number) basis with the exception of walk/trot (jog) classes. Walk/trot (jog) classes will be split at the direction of the show management. There will be no trades between the split sections as posted unless approved by show management.
- Each split section will receive duplicate awards in the preliminary classes.
- The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to cancel any class after the closing date of entries where there are less than three (3) entries. In case of cancellation, entry fee shall be refunded. Where warranted, classes may be combined.

STALL ASSIGNMENTS

Stall assignments will be available at the Barn Manager's office/Kuhlwein Feed & Bedding. Requests for stabling with an exhibitor or trainer must have mutual requests on both entry blanks. Stabling will be based on sponsorships, tenure and number of horses entered.

STALL COUNT BY THE OEC

The Ohio Expo Commission reserves the right to take stall counts by a video camera or by manual count. This Count may be taken any time during the show.

STALL FEES

Box and tack stalls are 125.00; **stall fees must be paid on all horses**. Stalls are permanent 10X10 with sliding doors. Absolutely no fronts or partitions may be moved in any way. No tape, staples, nails etc. are to be used on stalls. Exhibitors will be responsible for damage to the stalls.

UPHA CLASSIC CLASSES-for 4 year olds only

The owner, exhibitor and professional trainer of a UPHA Classic entry must be an Active member of the UPHA in good standing, and their membership number must appear on the entry blank. If a non-professional is exhibiting the horse they must be an Associate or Junior member of the UPHA, in good standing, and their membership number must appear on the entry blank.

A non-refundable Eligibility Fee of \$100.00 paid to the UPHA Office postmarked on or before April 1st of each year. After April 1st, the Eligibility Fee becomes \$150.00 per horse. Payment of the Eligibility Fee will be made in the name of the entered horse or pony and will make that animal eligible to compete in any and all UPHA Classics classes held that year. Eligibility remains with the animal throughout the year should transfer of ownership occur. Entries in the UPHA Classic classes qualify for their respective Junior Horse Championships.

USEF / AMHA FORUM

There will be an USEF / AMHA Rules Forum following the morning session on Thursday, June 13, 2024, in the seating area behind the Coliseum announcer platform.

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of this competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State, See GR908.4.

USEF COMPETITION FEES

The USEF fee of \$23.00 per horse will be assessed which includes the \$15.00 Drug and Medications fee and the \$8.00 competition fee.

A non-member, who wishes to participate as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides, Reining Competitions, Vaulting Competitions, and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, must pay a Show Pass fee (\$45) for each competition in which competing. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner need be a Member or pay a Show Pass fee. *EC* 11/18/13 Effective 12/1/13.

USEF MEMBERSHIP RULE

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and

races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

- Wire-wheeled vehicles are not permitted.
- Headers may be used for single hitches, but must come from within the vehicle. Multiple hitches must carry a header at all times.
- The Carriage Driving Champion will be awarded to the exhibitor / horse combination which accumulate the highest number of points throughout the show for competing in any carriage driving class listed below. In the event of a tie the highest placing in the reinsmanship class will break the tie. The following classes will be considered for this award: 113, 131 & 133. Points are accumulated on the following basis: First Place-5 points, Second Place-3 points, Third Place-2 points, Fourth Place-1 point.

- The certificate qualifies you to compete in a class of 3 year old park harness horses at the Morgan Gold Cup horse show. You must declare your desire to participate by the closing date of entries for the show.
- Any 3 year old Morgan is eligible to compete for the class. The entry does not have to be sired by a stallion participating in the stallion service auction. Eligibility is determined by certificate. A certificate is owned by the purchaser of a stallion service or by the stallion service provider. The owner's name on the certificate must match the owner's name on the registration of the horse entered in the class.
- Certificates are good for only one year. The certificate must be presented in hard copy prior to the competition and will not be reissued, do not lose your certificate.
- This certificate may only be transferred if a voucher owner gives written notice that a certificate is sold with a horse. At that time, the certificate entry becomes applicable for that horse only. A copy of the transfer will be mailed to the new owner and must be presented along with the original certificate for entry into the class. To transfer the certificate with a sold horse, contact the Breeders Cup secretary for the proper transfer form.



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
